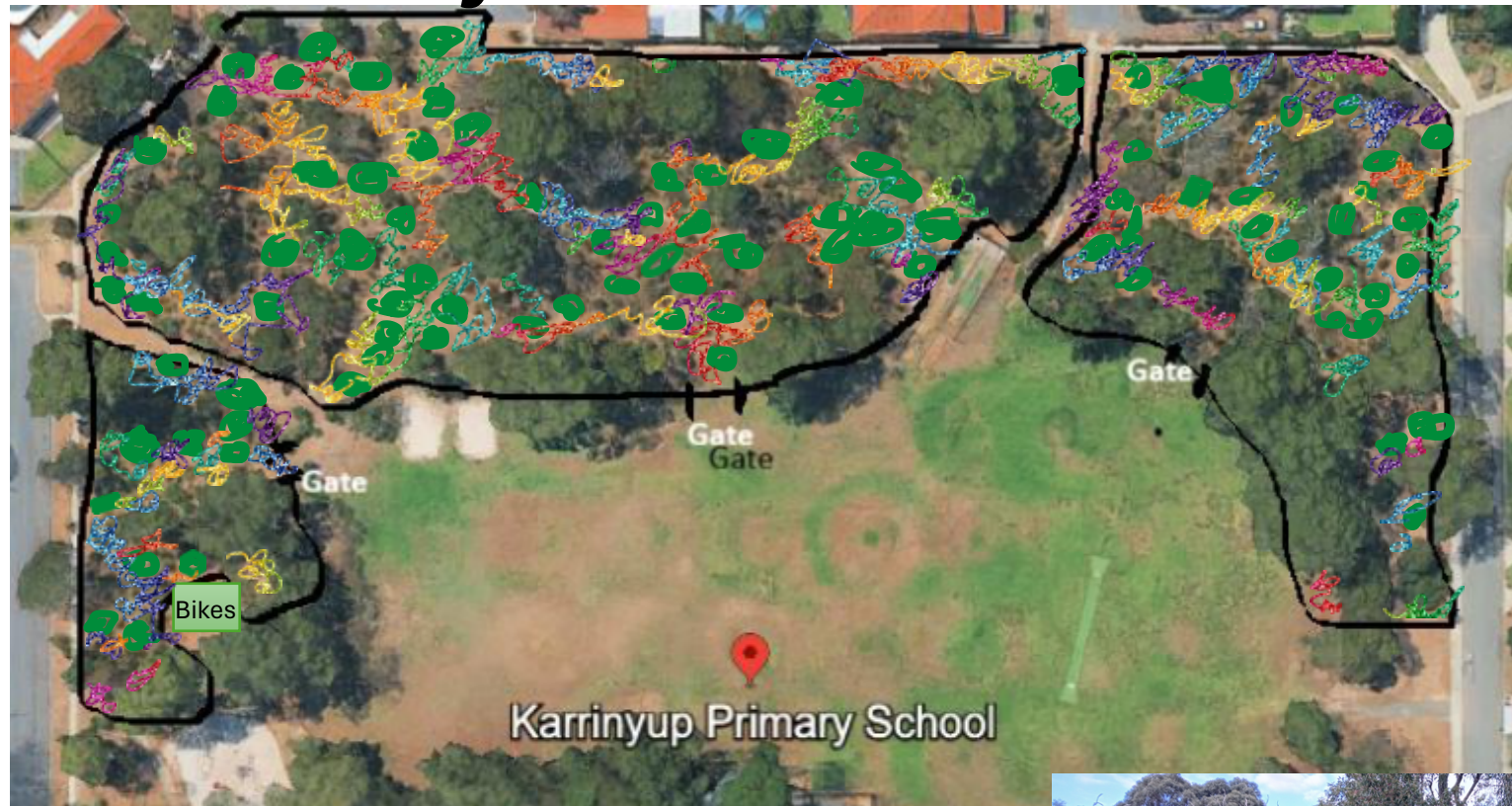

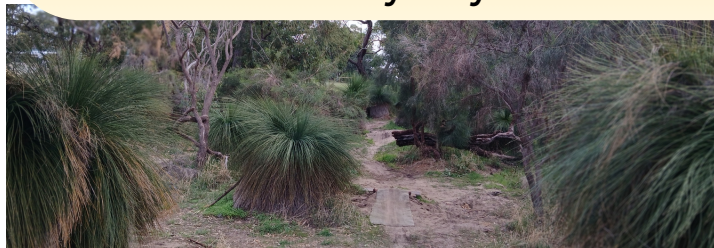
Proposed Biodiversity Area

WHY IS ACTION NEEDED?

Invasive weeds such as veldt grass are replacing native plants
Dense weed growth increases summer fire risk
Mature tree resilience declining - spread of dieback and disease
Native wildlife habitat is declining
Ground cover destroyed by bike tracks

Develop a living outdoor classroom for students
Build community stewardship of local bushland
